Migration and Integration Research

Since 2005, the Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF) has carried out research on migration and integration issues on the basis of an official mandate (Section 75 No. 4 and 4a of the Residence Act). It thereby contributes to the transfer of information between academia, administration, politics and the public.

The BAMF Migration, Integration and Asylum Research Centre

Research Data Centre (BAMF-FDZ)

Upon request, the BAMF-FDZ makes the Federal Office's register and survey data available to research institutes for migration and integration research. The BAMF-FDZ prepares the data and reviews applications for data access. In the case of a favourable decision, it facilitates data access on site or transmits the data.
